A Better Way to Fundraise: A Communication Plan for the 2025 *Many Gifts, One Nation*

Creating Early and Consistent Engagement for Impactful Giving

To build a meaningful tradition around the NCEA *Many Gifts, One Nation* annual day of giving, early engagement and consistent communication are essential. For Catholic schools, aligning this day of giving with Celebrate Catholic Schools Week (CSW) has proven powerful. Families anticipate this week each year, as it's filled with events that celebrate faith, service and community.

At BetterWorld, we've seen firsthand how early communication amplifies giving. According to studies on donor behavior, engagement campaigns that start at least six weeks before an event increase participation and donations by up to 30 percent. By beginning outreach at least a month ahead, schools can lay the groundwork for families to understand the impact of their contributions, inspiring them to be part of something bigger.

An example of one school's efforts to tie a day of giving to a community-centered tradition, such as CSW, paid off with \$27,000 raised in the first year. With continued promotion and engagement, the amount increased to \$48,000 the following year, highlighting the power of momentum. By incorporating matching gifts from the school board or local donors, they further maximized giving and inspired even more involvement.

Schools can take steps to build this momentum by consistently sharing stories of impact, showcasing the difference past donations have made and aligning each communication with the spirit of community and service that defines Catholic education. With each year, the tradition grows stronger and families feel a deeper connection to the cause.

Engaging Families in the Day of Giving: A Consistent and Inspired Approach

To make *Many Gifts, One Nation* a truly impactful event, Catholic schools must build awareness gradually, with thoughtful, consistent communication that connects families deeply to the cause without overwhelming them. At BetterWorld, we've found that a well-planned communication plan can significantly increase participation and amplify impact.

Studies show that donors who receive reminders through varied channels—email, social media, direct mail and even text—are 25 percent more likely to engage than those who receive communication through just one channel. By leveraging each channel strategically, schools can create a cohesive, inspiring campaign that builds anticipation and maximizes giving.

Here's a roadmap for schools to consider:

Early January: As students return from Christmas break, begin integrating *Many Gifts, One Nation* messaging into existing communications to set the stage and create awareness. Mention it in the weekly newsletter, in teachers' notes to home and in announcements on social media.

Two Weeks Before: Send a personal touchpoint, such as a postcard, to families and grandparents. Include heartfelt images of students and a simple message like, "Join us in supporting Catholic education during *Many Gifts, One Nation*—help us reach our \$50,000 goal!" Include a QR code linking to the donation page, making it easy for supporters to take action. A study by the Nonprofit Times revealed that direct mail paired with digital calls to action, like QR codes, increases donation rates by up to 15 percent.

The Day Before: Send an email featuring a short, professionally crafted video that showcases the impact of Catholic education. Include scenes of students praying, learning and laughing together. The video should be engaging and uplifting, highlighting the core values of faith and community. This email, arriving at the top of inboxes, primes recipients to engage and support the next day. A study on video marketing by HubSpot showed that emails featuring videos have click-through rates 65 percent higher than those without.

Day of *Many Gifts, One Nation*: Throughout the day, remind families with a series of gentle nudges, like "It's time for *Many Gifts, One Nation*! Join us in making a difference." These can be sent through emails, social media updates and even brief reminders in school announcements. A well-timed social media post in the morning, afternoon and evening captures different parts of the community and ensures that the message reaches everyone without being overwhelming.

Final Push: As the day winds down, send a final message—"Last Chance to Make an Impact!" This gentle reminder can create a sense of urgency for those who haven't yet donated, often resulting in a final wave of contributions.

The Right Marketing Channels to Inspire Giving and Strengthen Community

To make *Many Gifts, One Nation* a successful and impactful event, Catholic schools need a thoughtfully designed, multi-channel approach to reach families and inspire them to participate. At BetterWorld, we've seen how diverse communication channels used in harmony can drive engagement and foster generosity and service.

Research shows that using multiple touchpoints can increase donor engagement by up to 30 percent and amplify campaign impact significantly. Here are the key channels schools can leverage to build a memorable day of giving experience:

- **Email:** As the backbone of digital communication, email offers a reliable, personal way to connect with families. Begin with early notifications about the upcoming event, followed by regular updates. Ensure emails are visually engaging, with a mix of storytelling, images and clear calls to action. Include a link to the donation page, and for maximum impact add a compelling video to boost click-through rates by 65 percent (HubSpot, 2023).
- **Social Media (Facebook and Instagram):** Social media is an incredible tool for generating excitement and reaching both current families and the extended community. With over 70 percent of parents using social media, schools can reach a broad audience by posting consistently in the weeks leading up to the event. Aim for three to four posts per week, showcasing student stories, "behind-the-scenes" moments and countdowns to the Day of Giving. Invite families to share these posts, expanding the reach and fostering a sense of community ownership.
- **Postcards and Direct Mail:** Adding a tangible element, like a postcard, creates a personal touch that families can hold onto. Direct mail has a 20 percent higher response rate when paired with digital communication, according to the Data & Marketing Association. Consider sending a beautifully designed postcard two weeks before the event, with photos of students and a clear QR code that links directly to the donation page. This approach ensures grandparents and extended family members who may not be on social media are also included.
- **Website:** Create a dedicated space on the school's website for *Many Gifts, One Nation*. This page can feature impact stories, a donation counter and testimonials to build excitement and convey the significance of giving. Be sure to make it easy to navigate with a direct link to donate. Many families will use the website as a central point of reference, so keeping it up-to-date is essential.
- **Weekly Newsletter:** For many schools, a weekly newsletter is the primary communication tool and incorporating *Many Gifts, One Nation* updates here is crucial. Begin highlighting the event a month in advance, adding reminders each week. Newsletters are also an ideal place to share links to social media posts and videos, creating a seamless experience that keeps families engaged without overwhelming them.
- **Video Content:** Short, heartfelt videos that tell the story of Catholic education's impact with visuals of students, teachers and the community, have proven to be highly effective. Share these videos in emails, on social media and on the website to reach families across platforms.

By strategically combining these channels, schools can create a thoughtful flow of communication. Start early with emails and newsletter mentions, add personal touches through direct mail, build social media momentum and deliver inspiring video content leading up to and during *Many Gifts, One Nation* itself.

Crafting Inspiring Day of Giving Messages for Maximum Impact

For a successful *Many Gifts, One Nation*, messaging should be clear, heartfelt and motivating, tailored to resonate with families, board members and the broader community. At BetterWorld, we've found that communicating a sense of purpose and urgency while emphasizing the tangible impact of each donation can drive significant engagement.

Core Message Themes:

1. According to fundraising studies, messages with a clear, student-centered impact resonate deeply and increase donation likelihood. "Today is the day to make a difference! Your support empowers students, funds scholarships and enhances technology. Join us in giving every student the opportunity to thrive in Catholic education." Messages should convey how donations will directly impact students, creating a sense of community-driven support and urgency.
2. Highlight the big-picture impact, especially to board members. "Help us reach our goal to transform Catholic education. Your support not only provides financial aid but also enhances professional development, resources and future-focused capital improvements." Focusing on strategic investments like technology and facilities speaks to the board's vision for long-term growth and excellence.
3. Create a sense of shared mission. "Be a part of something bigger! Join us in supporting Catholic education and giving every child the chance to succeed. Let's come together to make a lasting difference." Emphasizing community participation in a mission-focused message helps foster broader involvement.

Effective Messaging Tactics:

- **Urgent Calls to Action:** Use phrases like "Today is the Day to Give," "Last Chance to Make a Difference" and "Join Us in Building a Brighter Future." This language emphasizes time sensitivity, encouraging immediate action.
- **Consistent Engagement:** Send three key emails—the night before, the morning of and a final reminder at the close of *Many Gifts, One Nation*. This cadence ensures the message stays top-of-mind without overwhelming supporters.
- **Social Media Alignment:** Mirror email themes on social media. Post four to five times on the day itself, sharing stories, videos and impactful highlights. A short video that showcases students, faculty and community moments can amplify engagement, with studies showing that video content can boost donor response by 65 percent.

With clear, inspiring and community-centered messaging, *Many Gifts, One Nation* becomes a powerful event that not only raises funds but strengthens the entire school community.

Strategies for an Impactful *Many Gifts, One Nation* Campaign

To make *Many Gifts, One Nation* memorable and impactful, focus on methods that connect the community, inspire generosity and convey the direct impact of each gift. At BetterWorld, we know that a multi-layered approach, blending storytelling, personalization and community engagement, leads to a powerful, cohesive campaign.

1. Tell Your Story Through Video

Video is one of the most compelling ways to showcase the impact of Catholic education. Create a series of short, heartfelt videos featuring students, teachers, families and donors sharing what the school means to them. Release these videos on social media and through emails in the weeks leading up to and during *Many Gifts, One Nation*. Encourage families and supporters to share them on their own profiles to broaden their reach. Studies show that campaigns using video content see up to 65 percent more engagement, as people are drawn to visual and emotional stories.

2. Early Save-the-Date Reminders

Building anticipation is key to a successful campaign. Send a "Save the Date" postcard or letter two to four weeks in advance, reminding families and donors of the upcoming *Many Gifts, One Nation*. This tangible touchpoint helps people plan ahead and feel more connected to the event. According to the Data & Marketing Association, direct mail boosts response rates, especially when paired with digital reminders.

3. Memorial and Honorary Gifts

Offer an option for donors to make their gift in memory or honor of a loved one. Personalized gifts carry a special significance and encourage a deeper emotional connection. Recognize these memorial gifts with acknowledgment cards, emails or mentions in the annual report. Research indicates that donors who feel a personal connection to their gift are more likely to give and continue supporting the cause.

4. Donation Reminders and Real-Time Updates

Help donors stay engaged by offering to send reminders on the day of via text or email. These gentle nudges keep *Many Gifts, One Nation* top-of-mind and encourage immediate action. Additionally, sharing real-time updates and progress towards your goal throughout the day fosters excitement and can increase donations as supporters rally to meet the target.

5. Involve Students and Parents

Involve students and parents directly by asking them to make personal calls to high-priority donors or past supporters. Provide them with a simple script that highlights the difference each gift makes. Studies on peer-to-peer fundraising show that personal outreach can increase participation by up to 20 percent as people respond to familiar voices and genuine expressions of gratitude.

By combining video storytelling, early reminders, personal touches and active community involvement, your *Many Gifts, One Nation* campaign and any other planned giving campaigns can inspire generosity, strengthen connections and make a lasting impact on Catholic education.

Sample Phone Scripts

Start making these calls the weekend before *Many Gifts, One Nation*. And again—treat this as a template. Add in any specific information, or tweak the language to fit your school’s voice.

If you reach a voicemail:

Tips for an Engaging Campaign

Use video. Create a series of videos involving donors, school families and students. Share these on social media in the weeks leading up to the event and encourage people to share on their own social media accounts.

Save the date. Send a letter or postcard two to four weeks in advance, reminding people about the event early on.

Memorial gifts. Allow donors to make their gift in memory of someone else, then share that information during *Many Gifts, One Nation*.

Donation reminders. In the early days of your campaign, offer to send donors a text or email when *Many Gifts, One Nation* goes live.

Involve students and parents. Ask them to make calls to high-priority donors. Use our handy sample script to help them along the way.

Engage community businesses. If you know any business owners or leaders with a strong connection to your school, ask them to help you spread the word about your campaign.

Take it offline. If you have in-person events during the fundraising drive (school ceremonies, sporting events, etc.), consider setting up laptops or iPads to make giving more immediate and easy. Or, offer to help people who are less familiar with online giving with hassle-free ways to make a donation.

Create a how-to list. Print out and post online step-by-step directions to making a donation.

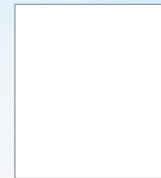
